Minutes of the meeting of Banwy Community Council held at Banwy Community Centre on Monday 4th November 2019 at 7.30 PM

Apologies (002) - Nil

Declaration of Interest (003) – Cllrs. L. Smith and J. Jones declared an interest in the planning application 19/1733/FUL.

Minutes of the last meeting (004) - The Council RESOLVED to accept the minutes dated 15th October as a true record and authorised the Chairman to sign them.

County Councillor's Report (007) –

Cllr. Alexander had requested a monthly meeting in the parish with the highways department and told that this wasn't feasible, she suggested that the Council write to Dave Gardener to request this again stating that it will save money and time in the long run.

The request for a no littering sign has to be requested through the highways department.

Representative Reports (008) –

Village Hall – No meeting had been held

Dyffryn Banw School – Cllr. G. Jenkinson had advised that the schools were looking to form an interim Governing body and was unsure what would happen.

Remembrance Sunday (009) –

Cllr. Smith advised everything was in order for the service and she had received the poppy wreath.

Community Lunch (010) –

The Councillors were handed leaflets to distribute within their allocated areas. An advert had also been put in the Plu'r.

Highways (012) –

It was reported that the gulleys were blocked west of Dyffryn and more salt was required for the small lanes through out the area.

Planning (013) -

19/1733/FUL – There was much discussion over this planning application from Council members and members of the public.

Many members of the public objected on environmental issues. The smell that would be produced, killing off too much wildlife.

Waste being spread of the fields would pollute water courses.

The condition and safety of the road was also raised as an issue, especially for cyclists who struggle to pass cars on the road never mind HGV's.

Clarification was required for the fact the application is for two units but the permit was for four. The agent advised that this was future proofing the site and if the applicant wished to build another two they would have to go through the whole planning process again. The permit also covered noise, pollution and odour from NRW which had been approved.

The agent advised that the ecology report had not been submitted but would be in the following days and the highway issue had been addressed with vast entrance improvement allowing vehicles to enter and leave safely. Some Councillors had had a site visit at the proposed site and were happy with their findings. A vote took place where five Councillors supported the application, 2 did not vote as they had declared an interest and one was against supporting the application, based on the results the Clerk was asked to write to PCC to advise that the Council supported the application.
